#### **Dues Drop to \$60**

My motion to reduce annual dues from \$75 to \$60 for 2009 was unanimously approved. Thanks to careful stewardship, the association's finances are solid enough to allow this 20 percent drop in anticipated income next year. I know \$15 a year isn't much, but I hope the reduction helps in difficult economic times.

#### **Two Garage Sales Again in 2009**

With only 10 homes participating in the August garage sale this year, I wondered whether we should continue having two a year. Residents at the annual meeting were solidly in favor of continuing that two-year-old tradition in 2009. The cost to the association is trivial, so we'll have two garage sales again next year.

The first will be Saturday, May 16 – as always, the Saturday before Memorial Day weekend. The second one is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 8; that's a week later than this year's sale and avoids the final weekend of the Coast Guard Festival. ### **City Officials Tout Streets Millage; Questioned About Traffic Safety, Landscaping Ordinances and Sidewalks**

We were pleased to have Mayor Jerry Wiersma and City Administrator Mark Meyers as our guests at the annual meeting. They spent about half an hour answering questions from residents, mainly focused on the millage the city is seeking for street repairs.

Most streets in our neighborhood rank very low in quality on an assessment of all city streets. While this does not necessarily mean they would be among the first to be repaved or rebuilt, it does increase the chances. And if the millage fails, Mr. Wiersma and Mr. Meyers say the city will proceed with special assessments on homeowners along a street to pay for repairs to that street.

Mr. Meyers agreed to check into accident history at the intersection of Seminole and McCracken after several residents complained of near misses there. The most likely change would be converting the intersection

to a four-way stop, he said, but traffic engineers will need to study the intersection first.

Mr. Meyers also agreed to meet with me to discuss whether city ordinances can be amended to deal with additional home and property maintenance problems. We'll be talking about whether the city can allow us to do the work or can do the work itself.

Jennifer Christman pointed out that there's a school bus stop at Dunes and Norcrest, but no sidewalk or curb but allowing kids to reach the street from the west side, and said she's concerned about safety issues come winter. Mr. Meyers noted that federal regulations would require a sidewalk stub and curb cut if Dunes Parkway is reconstructed, and agreed to talk with me about that and similar work at a few other locations.

I hope to meet with Mr. Meyers on these issues this fall and report the results in the next newsletter.
